

CREDIT CARD “GOTCHAS”

Message from Keith Sultemeier, President & CEO, Kinecta Federal Credit Union

The majority of us carry credit cards. They are easy and convenient ways to both pay and borrow. In addition, many cards today come with attractive perks – cash back, airline miles, purchase insurance, and more.

Savvy consumers have been trained to watch interest rates to be sure they are not paying more than is necessary to finance their purchases. But some credit cards may be costing you in other ways.

According to a recent survey by creditcards.com, the average card carries six fees; two cards in their survey had 12.

Reading the legal disclosures that come with your card can be a real pain, and although we encourage you to read your account disclosures, we realize that many of our members probably don't do this. Credit card companies know that too, and unlike Kinecta, they might seek to profit from this fact.

Among the fees you might not expect are those for going over your credit limit (even if you are paying your bill on time), annual fees (yes, these still exist), balance transfer fees, cash advance fees, penalty interest (your rate goes up if you make a late payment), and many more. Some fees can be controlled by being careful, such as a late payment fee, but some can't, such as foreign transaction fees. One card issuer even goes so far as to charge \$25 when their cardholders qualify and receive a credit limit increase.

A good strategy is to do your banking with an institution you trust to act in your best interest.

Kinecta is built for members, not-for-profit. We don't answer to shareholders. We answer to you, our member-owners. It's easy to be dazzled by some of the perks offered, but don't neglect to check how much you may be paying for those perks behind the scenes.

Kinecta recently updated its line of MasterCard® products to include a no annual fee cash back rewards card and our MyPower MasterCard that has no fees at all. Kinecta's rewards card is one of the few available with no annual fee where you can earn 1%, 2%, or 3% cash back depending on the type of purchase and where the bonus categories do not change. Additionally, of the 100 cards listed in the creditcards.com survey (which did not include Kinecta) only one had absolutely no fees, so our MyPower card is in elite company.

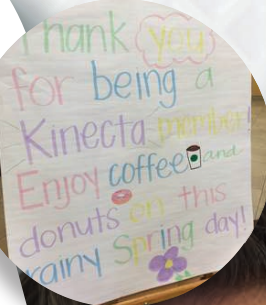
